What is Restorative Practice?

Restorative Practice is an approach to building, maintaining, and repairing relationships in your education community.

Instead of focusing solely on punishment when things go wrong, it emphasises open dialogue, accountability, and repairing harm.

What does it achieve?

Students develop **emotional literacy** and skills which enable ownership of issues and solutions, and this contributes to a culture of **resilience, empowerment** and **respect for others**.

Improved quality of relationships **enhances learning** within the classroom.
